First Responder Occupational Exposure to Opioids

Police officers and firefighters responding to emergency calls may be at risk for occupational exposures to a variety of illegal drugs, including opioids such as fentanyl and heroin. The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) recently published two-health-hazard evaluation (HHE) reports highlighting responder failure to wear proper personal protective equipment (PPE) when suspected opioids were visible.

Do your first responders have the right PPE to protect them on emergency calls? Have they had training on their PPE?
