OSHA Top 10 Safety Violations FY 2024

During the 2024 National Safety Council (NSC) Congress & Expo, OSHA's Director of the Directorate of Enforcement Programs, Scott Ketcham, announced the preliminary list of OSHA's top 10 most frequently cited standards for fiscal year (FY) 2024.

As with most years, the FY2024 list remains mostly unchanged other than some shuffling in order. For the 14th consecutive year, Fall Protection – General Requirements tops the list by a wide margin, with 6,307 violations, a 13% decrease from FY2023. The total number of violations on the FY2024 Top 10 list experienced an 12% decrease overall from FY2023 yet is still 18% higher than FY2022. Hazard Communication, Ladders, Respiratory Protection, and Lockout/Tagout round out the FY 2024 top five. Scaffolding saw the largest fall down the list, moving from the spot 4 to 8, due to a 34% decrease in total violations from 2023.

NSC President and CEO, Lorraine Martin, emphasized the oft-repeated appearances on the list, stating, "While incredible
