BLS Releases 2023 Injury and Illness Data

The United States Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) published the 2023 non-fatal injury and illness data on November 8, 2024. You can view the data at the following link: <u>https://www.bls.gov/iif/nonfatal-injuries-and-illnesses-tables.htm#summary</u>

You can now compare your injury and illness rates to the industry average:

- 1. Calculate your Total Case Incidence Rate (TCIR)
- 2. Calculate your Days Away, Restricted, and Transferred (DART) rate
- 3. Know your organization's North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code

- 4. Open *TABLE 1. Incidence rates of nonfatal* occupational injuries and illnesses by industry and case types, 2023 on the BLS website to see the published 2023 data
- 5. Compare your TCIR and DART rate against the 2023 industry averages listed in Table 1.

For more information on how to calculate your TCIR/DART rates, review the SMCX's <u>Calculating Injury</u> and <u>Illness Incidence Rates</u> one pager.

If you are pursuing OSHA VPP approval, you can only compare your TCIR and DART rate to BLS data published from <u>one of the last three</u> years, meaning 2021, 2022, or 2023. You can no longer use 2020 for comparisons.
